### **Shining A Light on History**

**Where to stay:** Holiday Inn Auburn – Finger Lakes Region, Hilton Garden Inn Auburn

**NYS Equal Rights Heritage Center** - Explore where iconic American heroes Harriet Tubman and William H. Seward lived and pay respects at Fort Hill Cemetery. See outstanding examples of Tiffany glass at the Willard Memorial Chapel. Discover the birthplace of talking films at the Cayuga Museum of History & Art and Case Research Lab.

**Harriet Tubman National Historical Park** – After approximately 13 trips south, rescuing 70 enslaved persons, the "Woman called Moses" settled in Auburn. Come and experience the indomitable spirit of this remarkable woman at the Home for the Aged, the Tubman residence, the Infirmary ruins and related sites.

**National Women's Hall of Fame**- Visit the National Women's Hall of Fame in Seneca Falls, New York and discover the stories of great American women who have shaped the nation. Learn about over 300 women and their pioneering contributions to the arts, athletics, business, education, government, humanities, philanthropy, and science.

**National Women's Right's Historical Park**- Women's Rights National Historical Park, a unit of the National Park Service, commemorates the first Women's Rights Convention held in Seneca Falls in 1848.

**Seward House** - visit the Seward House Museum, the historic home of William Henry Seward and his family. Serving as a New York State Senator, Governor of New York, a U.S. Senator, and as Secretary of State in the Lincoln and Johnson administrations, Seward was one of the foremost politicians of nineteenth century America.

**Underground Railroad Landmarks** – Research and drive by dozens of Underground Railroad stops that dot the Finger Lakes Region.
