


Distance 1.6 miles Difficulty ★ ☆ ☆

Shared for hiking and biking during the summer, this trail was converted from an old railroad bed. The trail head begins with old railroad ties laid across the trail that are partially exposed on the trail surface. This makes for a slightly uneven first .25 mile after which it becomes a mostly flat, dirt and cinder trail. This is a 1.6 mile trail through scenic woods, wetlands and farmland connecting Rt. 34 in the Town of Fleming to Dunning Avenue in the City of Auburn. The trail crosses over a couple of small bridges, one that is constructed of railroad ties and the other of steel. Neither have guardrails and both cross shallow creeks.







Auburn-Fleming Trail, 220 Dunning Avenue, Auburn, NY 13021 Parking is available at the northwest entrance on Dunning Avenue, a quarter mile south of Clymer Street.

The trail head is sign posted.
